

Having trained together in freezing conditions and snow-drifts, this warm-spell was a shock to the system to say the least, but they both completed the course safely and in great times of 3h39m and 4h25m respectively. The boys were raising money for Brooke - Action for Working Horses and Donkeys, which is an international charity that helps the hardest working equines from the poorest communities around the world. Last year, Brooke was able to reach and help over 2 million horses, donkeys, and mules across Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Middle East.

The aim was to raise over £6000, which seemed like a very ambitious target. Thanks to the amazing generosity of our wonderful clients, family members, friends, and a few of the companies we work with too, this target has been smashed. At the time of writing the total stands at a brilliant £8,456.67!
